Risk - assessment, analysis and management in child protection

Content:

1. Looking at case where things have gone wrong.
2. The referral process - what happens when a referral raises concerns about a child's safety.
3. Examining and using the tools used by Social Workers in Safeguarding in the UK, for eg Core Assessment.
4. Risk heightening and risk reduction factors.
5. Multi agency working - responsibilities and forums.
6. Long term management of cases where concerns persist through to adoption and where concerns are reduced through the implementation of a plan to protect the child.

Methods:

1. Some traditional lecturing.
2. Self directed study in small groups.
3. Role play.
