Service Learning: Nurturing social responsibility among students

Content:

Service learning provides students with opportunities to capitalize on their cognitive, affective, intuitive, and societal characteristics—those characteristics which differentiate learners from other learners. Through service learning, students are empowered to explore their own interests and passions, attempt to solve societal problems, employ leadership skills, and examine their own sense of justice while investigating authentic community issues and concerns. The scope of this project is to provide students an opportunity to build their capacity in the areas of Service Learning. They will be trained to identify and assess the community needs and develop intervention plans. The project aims at building capacity on the process of service learning such as need assessment, programme formulation, programme implementation, impact assessment and documentation. It also focuses on capacity building on street plays, campaigns and documentaries. The students will have to develop intervention plans/models in areas such as welfare and development of society, health and well-being of communities, unity of people in the society, enhancement of social functioning, etc.

Methods:
